Due to the sudden onset and rapid progress of hypertensive intracerebral hemorrhage, this kind of patients usually have limb hemiplegia, language impairments, dysphagia, and other sequelae. Severe emotional fluctuations can induce recurrent bleeding, which has a negative impact on the prognosis. Nursing staff currently represent the primary source of clinical care for hypertensive intracerebral hemorrhage patients at their convalescent stage, and this is problematic as they simply follow the doctor's advice in a mechanical way. This study explored the preventive value of tripartite intensive intervention for elderly hypertensive intracerebral hemorrhage patients. Overall, this study is very interesting. The aim is clear and the methods are described in detail. Only some minor language editing is required. Thank you.
