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Abstract

Mucinous adenocarcinoma (MAC) is a unique clinicopathological subtype of colorectal

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Mucinous colorectal adenocarcinoma is a distinct **subtype** of **colorectal cancer** (CRC) characterized by the presence of abundant extracellular mucin which accounts for at least 50% of the tumor volume. **Mucinous colorectal adenocarcinoma** is found in 10%–20% of CRC patients and occurs more commonly in female and younger patients.
