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Science Editor: 1 Scientific quality: The manuscript describes a minireview of the druggable monogenic immune defects hidden in diverse medical specialties. The topic is within the scope of the WJCP. (1) Classification: Grade B; (2) Summary of the Peer-Review Report: This manuscript is well written and gather in a brief and informative group of manifestations as well as organ/system disorders resulting from monogenic immune defects. The questions raised by the reviewers should be answered; (3) Format: There are 2 tables and 2 figures; (4) References: A total of 93 references are cited, including 51 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There are 5 self-cited references. The self-referencing rates should be less than 10%. Please keep the reasonable self-citations (i.e. those that are most closely related to the topic of the manuscript) and remove all other improper self-citations. If the authors fail to address the critical issue of self-citation, the editing process of this manuscript will be terminated; and (6) References recommendations: The authors have the right to refuse to cite improper references recommended by the peer reviewer(s), especially references published by the peer reviewer(s) him/herself (themselves).
