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Science Editor: 1 Scientific quality: The manuscript describes a minireview of the interrogating the interplay of angiogenesis and immunity in metastatic colorectal cancer. The topic is within the scope of the WJM. (1) Classification: Grade A and Grade D; (2) Summary of the Peer-Review Report: In this review, the authors have reviewed the relevant literature and the recent advances on angiogenesis inhibitors focusing on Bevacizumab, a monoclonal antibody that targets VEGF-A. They also wrote a section on how the microvascular density increases during the progression of adenoma to adenocarcinoma through abnormalities in vasculature, and on how cancer cells enter the blood circulation enhancing tumor metastasis. The section on micro-RNAs which can serve as biomarkers is highly relevant and adds strength to the paper. The questions raised by the reviewers should be answered; (3) Format: There are 2 tables and 1 figure; (4) References: A total of 70 references are cited, including 28 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There is 1 self-cited reference. The self-referencing rates should be less than 10%. Please keep the reasonable self-citations (i.e. those that are most closely related to the topic of the manuscript) and remove all other improper self-citations. If the authors fail to address the critical issue of self-citation, the editing process of this manuscript will be terminated; and (6) References recommendations: The authors have the right to refuse to cite improper references recommended by the peer reviewer(s), especially references published by the peer
