Reviewer #1 (00060494)

1. It is a rare case but not novel finding

Answer: We agree with this comment and have ensured that wording in the manuscript reflects this.

2. In your article, the proper noun should use the full term and then an abbreviation should be used in the other. Therefore, ischaemic heart disease appeared in the Case report section, 2nd paragraph, 4th line should change to IHD.

Answer: Thank you, we have made this change.

3. cardiovascular risk factors should include not only HTN and DM, but also aged and female post menopause

Answer: Thank you, this was an omission on our part and we have now included these two risk factors in the case report.

4. You may illustrate the resting EKG in your article

Answer: The ECG is now included as Figure 1.

5. Furthermore, you may take a literature review of discussion for this case in your article

Answer: A brief review of the aetiology and epidemiology has now been included.
