This interesting case report "Paraneoplastic neurological syndrome with positive anti-Hu and anti-Yo antibodies: A case report" describes the coexistence of 2 antibodies in a patient with 2 solid cancers that cause paraneoplastic neurological syndrome (PNS). Although is a rare case it seems that coexistence depends of the presence of 2 different tumors related to each antibody. I have several questions regarding this case: What is the point or hypothesis of coexistence of 2 antibodies? Poor survival? Is there evidence of synchronous solid tumors with 2 antibodies as your case? Or is the first report? This question must be answered in discussion section. Also, it would be helpful if authors should share photos or pictures of 2 antibodies in order to attract attention: remember that you are trying to publish something noticeable in World Journal of Clinical Cases. I consider it is mandatory more pictures about case. Another question: A Papanicolau/block cell of cerebrospinal fluid was made? What are the differential diagnosis of your case? Leptomeningeal disease is more reasonable in this case with 2 synchronous tumors that could affect central nerve system.
