## Question 1: Is sclerosing gland a precursor to prostate adenocarcinoma?

Answer: Long-term follow-up observation is recommended. In this study, although the PSA values of most patients with sclerosing adenopathy were within the reference range, patients should be informed that long-term follow-up observation should be performed.
