The status of portal hypertansion is missing . 4. Regarding the aortic metastasis , the authors should provide more informations (they were resected?) 5.why did they perform the liver biopsy? (the risk of peritoneal metastasis is high and the guidelines not recommand it if the patient undergo surgery)6. At the disussion section there are some contradiction regarding the status of lymph node and the survival rate . 7. The conclusions section is missing. 8. The abstract is too long and containe abbreviations 9. The picures are accurate and well picked.
