Introduction is satisfactory but should include the incidence and severity of disease caused by the pathogen. Case report is well elaborated. Discussion needs to stress on the pathogenicity of the organisms as well as more elaboration on clinical features of this infection. Grammar check for correction of tenses is necessary. Conclusion is satisfactory. Figures are quite illustrative. Overall a very interesting case report.
