Authors showed a case of liver SFT, a rare tumor of the liver. In present case, a brain tumor was resected before 7 years, and authors diagnosed the liver tumor metastasized from the brain tumor. Present case was rare and interesting. But several issues remained to be addressed. First, in present case, chronic HBV infection was found. HBV status such as HBsAg, HBV-DNA or presence of NA treatment should be described. Second, authors should evaluate the possibilities of other metastases such as lung. Third, authors should discuss the mechanism of solitary liver metastasis from meningeal SFT with previous references.
