On behalf of the authors, I would like to thank Reviewers, Science editor, Company editor-in-chief for their careful review and valuable comments. At the same time, We would be honored if this manuscript could be published in *the World Journal of Clinical Cases*.

To answer the question posed by Reviewer #1: In this case, the cyst ruptured in the posterior abdominal cavity due to the inadvertent pulling of the cyst during the operation, and a small amount of gelatinous contents flowed out immediately. We used a negative pressure drainage to suck out the contents of the cyst to prevent spreading. It should be noted that, as you said, we usually do not drain the cyst contents during the operation, and try to remove the cyst as completely as possible to ensure that the cyst contents will not spread to other places.

To answer the question raised by the Science editor: We reviewed the published literature again and found no data on the incidence rate of epidemiology, but we have counted the total number of cases reported in English in previous literature.
