However, I think that this work need revision in order to publish. Below are my concerns. 1. What is LDLT short for? 2. The part of liver transplantation and sexual functions is quiet confusing. 3. The author did not describe the efficacy of PDE-5 inhibitors for sexual dysfunction, however mentioned a lot about its side effects and effect of HVPG changes? 4. What is the difference of figure 3 and 4? 5. The author mentioned that most patients with cirrhosis with sexual dysfunction have decreased quality of life. How much is the quality of life decreased in patients with cirrhosis with sexual dysfunction compared with those without sexual dysfunctions? 6. The structure of the article is a bit messy, please organize the context better

Comments to authors In this manuscript, Rakesh Kumar Jagdis et al have provided a review on the causes, assessment and treatment in patients with sexual dysfunctions and chronic liver diseases. This is an important and timely summary of sexual disturbances in liver diseases. Although this review is informative, the reviewer has a few concerns listed below to improve this manuscript . 1)The authors should provide a global epidemiological data of sexual dysfunctions in chronic liver. 2)A lack of information on how chronic liver diseases affect sexual dysfunction. Also, what about the interplay? 3)The discussion should be greatly improved, not just a descriptive summary of the topic. The authors should add their prospects. 4)The manuscript needs careful proof, as several grammatical mistakes were seen.
