I think the authors need to correct the title and key words. The words "case report" are not there. The abstract summarizes well the work described in the manuscript. The recent findings and their relevance to the literature are stated in a clear manner. The text is well written, the possibility of an association between eosinophilia and autoimmune hepatitis as well as the hypotheses for the pathophysiology of the association were analyzed and discussed by the authors. The references are not so updated but they are adequate to the authors' purpose.
