SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

I would like to congratulate the authors for the good work they have been putting in the production of this paper, which appears to be a pretty clear and concise resumè of the knowledge around GI malignancies and GH. I would like to suggest the authors to put in the text a short reference to the newly proposed weekly formulations of rhGH that are currently starting to be used in Europe, and to discuss whether the more prolonged stimulation by the rhGH both in adults and children could or could not be more dangerous in comparison to the daily one, at least highlighting that this could be a topic that we could be having to deal with in the near future. I would also like to recommend the authors to put in the paper an image or graph that highlights the mechanisms of hormonal action on GI tract, to facilitate the reading of the text.
