prolonged hospitalization and requires multiple interventions. These patients are at risk of malnutrition.

There is no proven pharmacotherapy for AP, however, apart from fluid resuscitation, analgesics, and

organ support, nutrition plays an important role in the management of AP. Oral or enteral nutrition is

the preferred route of nutrition in AP, however, in a subset of patients, parenteral nutrition is required.

Enteral nutrition has various physiological benefits and decreases the risk of infection, interventions,

and mortality. There is no definite proven role of probiotics, glutamine supplementation, anti-oxidants,

and pancreatic enzyme replacement therapy in patients with acute pancreatitis. In General: it's a good
