1. *"Needed discussion of preoperative liver function evaluation."*

Thank you very much for the revision of our manuscript. Data has been added and highlighted in red in the text. The additional reference is also highlighted in red.

2. *"Suggested presentation of comparative tables of different techniques."*

After a thorough search of our references as well as the wide spectrum of current literature, we believe that it is not feasible to create a sufficient comparative table. There are not enough data in order to compare these procedures. Moreover, portal vein maneuvers are combined with two-stage hepatectomies, and comparative studies have not been reported.

3. *"Language polishing needed."*

1. *"Indications and limitations: I think the text should be shortened in this section. Mainly in the "Indications and limitations" part, the text appears too long and complex to be rightfully followed. Consequently, I suggest to reduce mainly this part;*

Thank you very much for giving us the opportunity to revise our manuscript. We have been asked by the other reviewer to add one more paragraph, instead of reducing this part. We chose to do both, since we agree that a discussion regarding preoperative liver function evaluation will add up greatly to the article, while shortening this section will remove some insignificant parts.

The phrase "The preoperative evaluation of patients with underlying liver disease usually consists of a biochemical panel, full blood count and Child – Pough classification." on page 8 has been deleted

The part "Another important point in this study... ..was proven to be an independent factor for a worse outcome." on page 5 has been removed.
