The manuscript is very well written and of clinical and academic importance, however the authors need to address few minor points as follows: - Any abbreviation should be mentioned at first time in details then use the abbreviation afterwards. eg. ESLD, LT, PSC, HRQOL - Please add a short paragraph about the differences of PSC in pediatrics regarding incidence, clinical presentation and prognosis. - Bacterial species should be written in italics. - In the parhogenesis section, the word that is repeated twice. Thanks
