Statistical analysis results of each parameter are provided with p value, but n [number of patients in that analysis] should be added every place that the data is written; in abstract, results and discussion. The reason is that each parameter has a different n, because the number of publications that provided such data is variable. Information about which studies included which parameters is in figures 2 and 3, but it should be made more explicit and obvious by provision of n each time.
