I would like to thank the authors for their scientific efforts. It has been reviewed on interventional radiology in gastrointestinal cancers. The article generally looks good in terms of spelling and language. This review article provides some interesting information. I think the following points should be addressed: (1) covered stent for arterial hemorrhage from pseudoaneurysm, which may accomplish both complete hemostasis and arterial flow preservation, (2) duodenal or rectal stent placement in malignant obstruction.

(rejection). I would expect some more explanations to your decision. Anyway, I accept it, but do not

share it.

Alberto Ferrarese:

This was a review on the role of interventional radiology for diagnosis and treatment of GI cancers. The paper has been submitted for the "Frontier" Section. Three Reviewers read the manuscript. Scientific quality C, C, C. Language Quality: A, A, C. Recommendation: Minor Rev., Major Rev, Rejection. The non-English speaker certificate has been provided. The COI disclosure should be added. One Reviewer said that there are typos throughout the manuscript. They should be corrected through a deep revision of the entire paper. The paper has been submitted for "Frontier" section, however, as mentioned by one Reviewer, it describes the current state of the art about interventional radiology for diagnosis and management of GI cancers. Therefore, I would suggest to change the layout of the manuscript from "Frontier" section to "Minireview". The first part may be deleted, accordingly. Conclusions: I suggest potential acceptance only after major revision (including the change of manuscript layout). Alternatively, it should be considered for Journal of GI Oncology.
