Thank you very much for handling our manuscript and providing us the opportunity to revise our manuscript entitled "Animal models for PTSD: an overview of models used in research " (20527). When checking the online system we noticed that one Reviewer (No. 2486909), showed an actual comment. This comment stated that no revision was required content-wise.

Regarding the style, however, several revisions were requested, according to Baishideng's www.wjgnet.com guidelines:

- Movement of the conflict-of-interest statement to a position closer to the top
- Addition of a core tip
- Addition of audio core tip
