However, the description was too long and hard to understand. Major comments. 1. The authors should make a table for summarizing several types of Ayurvedic Herbs. They should show main causative agents contained in Ayurvedic Herbs, type of liver injury (e.g., cholestasis, hepatocellular necrosis, sinusoidal obstruction, etc.), authors and countries of the report, risk of mortality, etc. 2. Figures seem too many. They should limit the figures.
