We would like thanks the editors and the reviewers for their positive criticisms regarding our manuscript entitled “Clinical Characteristics, Gastrointestinal Manifestations and Outcomes of COVID-19 Patients in Iran; Does the location matters?” for consideration of publication in WJG.

Below, we answered the reviewer’s comments. We also added the required documents as was requested.

The reviewers’ minor issues:

1 As the authors mentioned, small sample size is the major limitation of this study

We agree with the reviewers, we are planning to collect and add more data for future studies.

2. lack of long-term follow-up data in this study

Long term follow up was not part of this study since the aim, scope and outcome of the study is different. We will consider it for future study.

3. Data related the duration of Gastrointestinal (GI) symptoms was also lacking.

GI symptoms reported in our study related to the admission and early hospitalization. This was added to the discussion.

5 EDITORIAL OFFICE’S COMMENTS

Science editor: 1 Scientific quality: The manuscript describes an observational study of the clinical characteristics, gastrointestinal manifestations and outcomes of COVID-19 patients in Iran. The topic is within the scope of the WJG. (1) Classification: Grade C; (2) Summary of the Peer-Review Report: This study aims to investigate the Gastrointestinal (GI) symptoms and comorbidities that associate with this pandemic in 4 different regions of Iran. The authors analyzed data from SARS-CoV-2 positive patients evaluated at hospitals of Iran. The results show hypertension and diabetes as the most common comorbidities. Nausea, diarrhea and

elevated liver enzymes were the most common GI symptoms. There was also a high mortality rate that associated with high infection rates in Iran in the beginning of the pandemic.

The questions raised by the reviewers should be answered; and (3) Format: There is 1 table and 7 figures. A total of 31 references are cited, including 23 references published in the last 3 years. There are no self-citations. 2 Language evaluation: Classification: Grade A. The authors are native English speakers. 3 Academic norms and rules: The authors provided the Institutional Review Board Approval Form. **The Biostatistics Review Certificate, and Written informed consent was not provided.** No academic misconduct was found in the Bing search. 4 Supplementary comments: This is an unsolicited manuscript. No financial support was obtained for the study. The topic has not previously been published in the WJG.

We added the Biostatistics Review certificate. There was not written consent form since the study used the chart review.

5 Issues raised: (1) The authors did not provide original pictures. Please provide the original figure documents. Please prepare and arrange the figures **using PowerPoint** to ensure that all graphs or arrows or text portions can be reprocessed by the editor; (2) The “Article Highlights” section is missing. **Please add the “Article Highlights” section at the end of the main text;** (3) If an author of a submission is re-using a figure or figures published elsewhere, or that is copyrighted, the author must provide documentation that the previous publisher or copyright holder has given permission for the figure to be re-published; and correctly indicating the reference source and copyrights. Please check and remove any references that not relevant to this study. 6 Recommendation: Conditional acceptance.
