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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The manuscript is very interesting and topical. It deals with the currently very important issue - IBD management during the COVID-19 Pandemic. Manuscript is well structured and well written. It provides in detail valuable information for clinicians. However, there are some statements that need reconsideration and improvement. For instance: - Section WHAT IS THE RISK OF SARS-COV-2 INFECTION IN THE IBD POPULATION? line 233 you wrote: «Thus, although there is limited evidence available, it seems that patients with IBD are not at greater risk of acquiring COVID-19, and SARS-Cov-2 infection does not seem to be more prevalent in patients with IBD than in the general population.» Such conclusion or statement may be too early to conclude. It is very likely that patients with IBD (as a group at higher risk of complications) were more self-protective and thus the results should be taken with caution! Future studies, with more patients will provide more data. See also Conclusion line 1244. - Section GASTROINTESTINAL SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19: this section is written in a way that the reader can get an impression that gastrointestinal and other organ symptoms are more important than respiratory ones. Please be careful with passing the information about gastrointestinal symptoms and other organs involvement (liver, pancreas etc). Please provide clear sentences when gastrointestinal symptoms are a complication of COVID19 respiratory symptoms and observed in hospitalized COVID19 patients with pneumonia and clearly separate this information from gastrointestinal symptoms that were found as the only symptom of coronavirus positive patients that did not need hospital treatment. Please go through the first part of this section (line 254-266) there are some sentences that need additional explanation and improvement accordingly. - Line 330 : respiratory tract flora: change flora with microbiota - Line 346: please explain in the text of the manuscript what you mean by “ACE2-mediated direct viral infection” for



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hepatic injury? - Line 454: please explain in the text of the manuscript what you mean by the term “the outpatient with IBD” (see also Tabel1, Tabel2, Tabel3) After reading the whole manuscript, I find the first part of the manuscript very good with the exeption of one section particularly section GASTROINTESTINAL SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 from line 253 - 362, which it seems that it does not fit well in this manuscript. The information in this section are interesting but are not properly associated in the contectext of the manuscript. So I wonder, why all these information were placed in the text if are not explained in the context of the aims of the manuscript - if authors think that all information in this section are needed for the understanding of the article, than they need to add additional text and explain it clearly. Otherwise may cause more confusion then benefit. In general, manuscript explains in detail how to manage IBD patients (many kinds of possiblities that can occur, including vaccination) in COVID19 pandemic. Manuscript will be of great help for clinicians in current situation.

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Authors followed the reviewer's suggestions. They also tried to improve-explain the term “the outpatient with IBD” (see also Tabel1, Tabel2, Tabel3) using wording »patients attending outpatient clinic with IBD« which sounds even more strange. My suggestion is to use the term »patient« because patient with IBD in remission or quiescent IBD or mild IBD etc is usually not hospitalised, particularly not in this pandemic era. In addition, authors explicitly stated cases when patients are hospitalized (see Table 4), which clearly indicate that the first 1-3Tables deal with patients that are not hospitalized. Otherwise, congrats for good work.
