Question 1: Judging from the paper, the main content includes 1. The pulmonary manifestations of COVID-19 and related imaging methods. 2. Extrapulmonary manifestations of COVID-19 and related imaging methods. 3. Other topics, such as children, infection control, delayed screening of other diseases, artificial intelligence, etc.

This sort of logical relationship may seem easier to understand. Question 2: In reference 117, regarding the extrapulmonary manifestations of COVID-19, in addition to injury to heart, digestive tract and nervous system which have been reviewed above, acute kidney injury, hyperglycemia and ketosis, ocular symptoms, and dermatologic complications also exist. Are there related imaging findings could be lessened or discussed ?

Question 3: Regarding the reasons for the limitations of AI in the diagnosis application of COVID-19, the selection bias of training data, the legislative procedure and related ethical support are all needed to be considered. Question 4: References 59, 85, 168, and 173 have some formatting issues.
