Comments to manuscript "Informed Consent for CPR KI-1 Yong Quan /PC-9 Zhong Chong Resuscitation Maneuver: Cost-Benefit Meta-Analysis Results as its Future Perspective" This manuscript provides an alternative perspective of upgrading heart stoppage survival rates using the traditional Chinese medicine (TCM) KI-1 Yong Quan /PC-9 Zhong Chong acupuncture points Resuscitation Maneuver when the ILCOR-CPR protocol has failed or is not available. The effectiveness of TCM acupuncture is well established. And this manuscript provides a new idea by applying the TCM acupuncture in CPR, and should be published if the following typos can be corrected: 1.

Page 4, line 1 to line 2 is a duplicate of line 3 to line 4: "Physiological testing in bilateral double amputees and healthy volunteers showed significant changes as regards heart rate variation on stimulating PC-9 Zhong chong," 2. Page 6, line 5 from bottom, "SoHo hypothesis" should be "So Ho hypothesis" The following reference by the same author on KI-1 Yong Quan should be included in the manuscript: 1) Inchauspe, A (2010) Traditional Chinese medicine K1 Yongquan and resuscitation: Another kind of "Lazarus phenomenon". RESUSCITATION, 81(4): 505-506. DOI: 10.1016/j.resuscitation.2009.12.009 There are 20 references as indicated in the online Abstract of this manuscript. Yet, the manuscript only contains 16 references, and the numbering seems not in consistency (for example, reference 13 in online Abstract should be authored by the author Prof Inchauspe, A, but the reference 13 in the manuscript is not a publication authored by Prof Inchauspe, A). Please make corrections to these references.
