SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is an advanced review on the influence of emotions on memory performance in healthy subjects. Authors deliver systematic evidence about the interference of emotional valence and arousal, and motivation on working memory. There is clear impact of the above factors, which is crucial in experimental settings and paradigm design. The present paper adds insight to the perspective of integrated processing of affective and cognitive stimuli. Authors are strongly encouraged to broaden the scope of their review in "Future directions" towards psychopathology by including 2-3 references and few sentences in that sense. My recommendation is to send the paper for careful language editing, as in some of the paragraphs English is inconsistent and confusing.
