Comment 1: The authors summarized the therapeutic advances which target genes uncommonly mutated in NSCLC. However, the info in this review appears not up-to-date. For sample, there are FDA approved therapies for NSCLC harboring BRAF V600E and Ret-fusions, and on 02.17.2021, The FDA granted priority review to sotorasib to treat patients with KRAS G12C-mutated locally advanced or metastatic non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC). All these information was not covered in the review. Also BRAF Non-V600 mutations were not covered in the review.

Response: We have updated the manuscript with the latest info about all drivers. Efficacy data is summarized in tables.

Overall, we would like to thank the reviewer remarks which have help us to improve substantially our manuscript.
