Symptoms Diagnosis

Lemierre's syndrome refers to infectious thrombophlebitis of the internal jugular vein. It most often develops as a complication of a bacterial sore throat infection in young, otherwise healthy adults. The thrombophlebitis is a serious condition and may lead to further systemic complications such as bacteria in the blood or septic emboli.

Klebsiella pneumoniae associated Lemierre's syndrome occurred in middle-aged adults (age ranging from 44 to 68 years) with no sex predominance. 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Apr 03, 2012 - The condition was better described by Andre Lemierre in 1936 from a report of 20 cases. The hallmark of the syndrome, as was originally described by Lemierre, is a tetrad of acute oropharyngeal infection, septicemia, thrombophlebitis of the ipsilateral internal jugular vein (IJV), and secondary metastatic abscesses, most commonly to the lungs and joints.
