(3) Format: There are 3 tables and 7 figures; (4) References: A total of 23 references are cited, including 4 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There is no self-cited reference. 2 Language evaluation: Classification: Grade A and Grade B. A language editing certificate was not provided because the authors are most likely native speakers of English. 3 Academic norms and rules: The authors provided the Biostatistics Review Certificate and the Institutional Review Board Approval Form. No academic misconduct was found by the Google search.
