The title and the abstract are adequate. The introduction is strict and concise. The methods are well-described, and the Results are quite interesting and innovative. The Discussion is well-structured, and the Conclusions are supported by the data. References are appropriate. Lastly, the English Language quality of the overall manuscript is pretty good. In conclusion, although this study has several limitations and authors' findings should be confirmed by further studies, I believe that this article may be suitable for publication in the WJG.

Undoubtedly, the difficulty in adapting the guidelines of adults to children is given by the lower incidence of HCC and compared to the main pediatric hepatic malignancy (HB) pathology. As suggested by the authors, the study has limitations, but the results are interesting. In the title it would be better to limit the use of abbreviations. In the abstract and in the core tip: avoid use of abbreviations. In the results, indicate the range of data shown instead of the mean. Recommendation: accept
