1. How is the fetus delivered, natural delivery or cesarean section? How many gestational weeks is the delivery time? Is there anything special about the fetus?

We went throughout patient's casenote and we noted that the fetus was delivered via cesarean section at 35 weeks of gestation without any issue reported concerning his wellbeing. A paragraph has been added in the report.

2. Has the blood test been done only once? Is there any more data? For example, before pregnancy and during prenatal examination.
