1.This is a good case report that sodium cyanide caused multiple strictures and ulcers in the esophagus, stomach and duodenum, leading to severe malnutrition, and finally leading to superior mesenteric artery syndrome causing duodenal obstruction. It is regrettable that the case lacked esophagography or gastroscopy results. 2.Follow-up time after surgery is too short, and it is recommended to follow up for more than half a year. 3. The description of imaging examination is not clear. CT can only describe the dilation or stenosis of a lesion, but not its correlation.

The present work is a case report of a successful surgical treatment for a patient presenting a superior mesenteric artery syndrome. While the image is clear, the writing is not organized. Though, there are major remarks that should be highlighted: 1- The introduction section is too long and too detailed. It should be rearranged and shortened. 2- The introduction section should end with a summary sentence presenting the case report. 3- English grammar and spelling should be verified. There are many faults. 4- In the physical examination, the vital signs should be stated before the abdominal examination. 5- The risk of gastric perforation was estimated based on which criteria? This point isn't clear in the text. 6- The discussion section should start with a summary sentence highlighting the strengths and weaknesses of the work. 7- The discussion section is too short. The pieces of information given had no references.
