Thanks to the dear editor who chose me to review this manuscript. General Comment: The current manuscript has reported a case that has been previously reported in similar cases and is not completely unique, but since its prevalence is low, it can be reported. Comment 1: Authors should provide appropriate references for their statements in the introduction section. Comment 2: In the case presentation, it is better for the authors to report the patient's paraclinical results including lipase, amylase, WBC, AST and ALT and any related tests that have been performed before and after the intervention in the form of tables. Comment 3: In the case presentation, the authors state "After ruling out other causes of pancreatitis"; These other causes of pancreatitis that have been ruled out should be mentioned. Comment 4: Some of the studies mentioned in the discussion section are not related to the manuscript and should be revised. Comment 5: It is better for the authors to increase the number of references by adding relevant content in the introduction and discussion section and increasing it to more than 10. Comment 6: The writing language of the manuscript is a bit complicated and heavy, and it is better to write it more fluently and simply.

Please consider whether the presence or absence of papillary tumor, biopsy near the pancreatic duct mouth, and the number of biopsies can be raised as the risk of developing pancreatitis, based on past literature.
