Acknowledgement section; Competing Interests; IRB approval when required	Informed consent from the person who is the subject of this case report is required by most journals	When appropriate include the assessment of the patient or client on this episode of care	Strengths and limitations in your approach to this case Specify how this case report informs practice or Clinical Practice Guidelines (CPG) How does this case report suggest a testable hypothesis? Conclusions and rationale	Clinician assessment (and patient or client assessed outcomes when appropriate) Important follow-up diagnostic evaluations Assessment of intervention adherence and tolerability, including adverse events	Types such as life-style recommendations, treatments, medications, surgery Intervention administration such as dosage, frequency and duration Note changes in intervention with explanation Other concurrent interventions	Evaluations such as surveys, laboratory testing, imaging, etc. Diagnostic reasoning including other diagnoses considered and challenges Consider tables or figures linking assessment, diagnoses and interventions Prognostic characteristics where applicable	Relevant physical examination findings	De-identified demographic and other patient or client specific information Chief complaint—what prompted this visit? Relevant history including past interventions and outcomes:	Information from this case report organized into a timeline (table or figure)	The current standard of care and contributions of this case—with references (1-2 paragraphs)	Background: What does this case report add to the medical literature? Case summary: chief complaint, diagnoses, interventions, and outcomes Conclusion: What is the main "take-away" lesson from this case?	The words "case report" should be in the title along with the area of focus Four to seven key words—include "case report" as one of the key words	Item Checklist item description
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
