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Science Editor: 1 Conflict of interest statement: Academic Editor has no conflict of interest. 2 Academic misconduct: No academic misconduct was found. 3 Scientific quality: The authors submitted a study of bowel preparation protocol for hospitalized patients aged 50 years or older. The manuscript is overall qualified. (1) Advantages and disadvantages: The reviewers have given positive peer-review reports for the manuscript. Classification: Grade B; Language Quality: Grade B. This manuscript describes a single centre single blinded randomised controlled trial regarding bowel preparation before colonoscopy among hospitalised patients. The study is powered for and include a subgroups evaluation of patients aged 75 years and above. However, there are issues with the manuscript that need to be revised: (1) Please provide a more detailed description of the randomisation process; (2) The randomisation process resulted in a somewhat surprising imbalance between the two treatment allocations. Please explain why in the Discussion section; (3) The "experimental" treatment allocation resulted in an almost 10% (the effect limit for the entire study group) difference for the main outcome variable among the most vulnerable patients-the right colon among those aged 75 years and above. Please problematise this finding further in the Discussion section; and (4) In many western countries I assume a varying proportion of the included patients would have been treated as outpatient cases. Please add some comments regarding applicability for the "experimental" regimen. (2) Main manuscript content: The



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author clearly stated the purpose of the study and the research structure is complete. However, the manuscript still require a further revision according to the detailed comments listed below. (3) Table(s) and figure(s): There are 1 Figure and 5 Tables should be improved. Detailed suggestions for each are listed in the specific comments section. (4) References: A total of 21 references are cited, including 3 published in the last 3 years. The author does not have self-cited references. The reviewer didn't request the authors to cite improper references published by him/herself. 4 Language evaluation: The English-language grammatical presentation needs to be improved to a certain extent. There are many errors in grammar and format, throughout the entire manuscript. Before final acceptance, the authors must provide the English Language Certificate issued by a professional English language editing company.
