Within more than just three years, two distinct nomenclatures, namely MAFLD and MASLD, have been proposed sequentially. It becomes important how do we address the newly defined MASLD. Should we adopt the new nomenclature but stick to the boundaries defined for MAFLD or adopt some of the newly defined terms such as MetALD and ALD within the spectrum of MASLD/NAFLD. There appear to be disparities in the nomenclature, definitions and implications on the management and outcomes. The author has very well addressed these issues.
