- A table comparing findings in different dementias has been included.
- We have included the designation "standardized" when referring to the olfaction tests table, since we only focused on standardized and validated tests.
- We've provided a commentary about guidelines and future directions in respect to olfactory assessment.
- The lack and need for baseline assessment and its role, impact and how this could be implemented were discussed.
- We have provided quantitative data in the "Olfactory loss associated with normal aging" section for normative olfactory performance and provided a reference for a systematic review on normative and pathological values in dementia for readers wanting to further explore these issues.
- In the Introduction section, authors listed estimates for the proportion of dementia individuals experiencing olfactory dysfunction based on individual studies.
