Reviewer Comments to Author: This manuscript is a review of the single-port laparoscopic surgery. The manuscript is well written overall. However, there are some questionable issues that should be reviewed/discussed in the manuscript. TITLE: The title of manuscript is accurately reflected the major topic and contents of the study. ABSTRACT: This section is sufficient for give objectives of the study. INTRODUCTION: 1. The section of introduction should be shortened (especially paragraph #2). OTHER SECTIONS: 1. These sections are written satisfactorily. The authors should removed the sentence written as "which conventional laparoscopic surgery does not have." from abstract and other sections. Because SPSS is nearly same to SPLS without camera assistant as authors mentioned. Already the authors have mentioned that SPSS have some difficulties such as static operative image and repositioning. Therefore, SPSS may benefit to reduce surgical assistant. The surgeon who works as single without assistant may use these technical instruments. This topic may emphasize especially.

RESPONSE: Thank you for your insightful and relevant comments. The text of the manuscript text has been changed as suggested. Specifically, the section of introduction has been shortened (especially paragraph #2). We removed the sentence written as “which conventional laparoscopic surgery does not have.” from abstract and other sections, because we totally agree with the reviewer’s opinion.
