## Response to Reviewer 2:

*This was a well written mini-review on the hemostasis in liver transplantation. Only two suggestions; would you mind explain the place and the role of the whole blood transfusion in emergency conditions when the hemostasis and the hemodynamical stability are severely broken down. Secondly, some spelling errors should be corrected.*

Concerning blood transfusion product use in liver transplantation, it is difficult to recommend certain procedures. Whole blood transfusion is not common in many countries and therefore I would prefer not to give recommendations which are regulated by the authorities in many countries. The spelling errors as well as language errors have been corrected by a native English speaker and anesthetist, who is now added to the authors (Dr. Szalai).
