I wish to express my compliments for your interesting review article on hepatocyte transplantation, reporting the results you have obtained in this still experimental field. There are not many Centers in Europe and elsewhere actively involved in this field on humans. The article is well written, clear and comprehensive. It lacks detailed description of materials and methods used, but this is in accordance with the divulgative nature of the article. I would suggest to better delineate the clinical results so far obtained by your group, and also by others, since only significant although preliminary results could justify the effort needed for such a difficult cellular therapy.

The manuscript describes clinical hepatocyte transplantation mainly from the technical standpoint. The manuscript is acceptable if authors revised following points; 1. One recent report of clinical hepatocyte transplantation is lacking (Enosawa et al, below). In this case hepatocytes were procured from unused segment of living donor. Cite the paper appropriately.
