The manuscript has been modified according to the suggestions of the Reviewer: The title has been changed to a more appropriate one. There is no known cut-off for serum 25-hydroxyvitamin D level below which patients develop osteomalacic syndrome. Symptoms of osteomalacia can often be vague and patients are sometimes labeled as having neurologic disorders. However, presenting symptoms of neuropathic joints are entirely different. X-ray abnormalities in pseudofracture are discussed. These are rarely confused with features of neuropathic joints.
