- 1) However, a short discussion of other urodynamic tests in women with voiding dysfunction may help complete the story.

We agree with you. However, we wanted to focus only on pressure-flow study. That is why we propose to change the title of the article to: "Diagnosis of voiding dysfunction by pressure-flow study in women".

REVIEWER N°2

Overall, a nice summary of the issues involving using urodynamics to evaluate voiding symptoms in women versus men. **Thank you very much.**

- 1) "Analyze" is misspelled in the Core tip and Abstract.

We have corrected them in the Core tip and Abstract.

- 2) It would be very useful if there was a table to summarize the various criteria that exists (acknowledging there is no hard and fast cut-off for the diagnosis of obstruction or acontractility) of voiding dysfunction in women. The various studies and their criteria of pdetqmax and qmax are described but a summary table would be helpful.

We added the proposed table (Table 3).

- 3) In addition, there is no conclusion or final summary of the authors' thoughts on the status of urodynamic evaluation of voiding behaviors in females. The paper stops short with simply practical considerations of urodynamic testing. There has to be some summary or suggestion of next step or interpretation of the data that exists in order to give some insight as to how an urologist should interpret urodynamics and use it to evaluate and diagnose voiding symptoms in female patients. You could use the "Core Tip" as your summary in the paper.

We agree with you and added a conclusion.

- 4) There should be titles to the figures.

In this article Tables have titles and Figures have “legends for figures” (which are written at the very end of the article). License was obtained to use the figures unchanged.
