This work looks more like as an Editorial rather than a Review manuscript. Moreover, this work is highly center and hospital specific. In some well established hospitals, the sense of radiation protection are very strong.

We agree with your comment regarding the type of manuscript. Our article is not a strictly review article. Radiation Protection Culture (RPC) is a new concept and therefore the literature on this topic is limited. However, we consider that RPC is a high interest topic. The role of RPC was first emerged by IRPA in 2009 and is also a hot topic in CIRSE conferences the last two years. The authors do not claim that all Radiology Departments have a weak sense of RP. However, even though every Radiology Department has rules and guidelines on radiation protection issues this does not necessarily mean that there is a culture concerning radiation safety. In any case, the authors do not judge each Department's policy about this issue. The objective of the manuscript is to highlight the role of RPC and to propose ways in order to establish or improve a RPC. Thank you!
