REVIEWER #1 COMMENTS TO AUTHORS:

The authors studied the influence of gynaecological oncologists on surgical and chemotherapeutic influence of standard of care of patient with ovarian cancer and their survival. They found that patient had survival advantage if treated by gynaecological oncologist. The finding is not unexpected as one would agree that standard of care will be better by a surgeon who is an expert in that field. Nevertheless, it is well written and a confirmation of our believe. REVIEWER #2 COMMENTS TO AUTHORS:

Comments: The authors investigated the influence of gynecologic oncologists (GO) in the U.S. on surgical/chemotherapeutic standard of care (SOC), and how this translates into improved survival among women with ovarian cancer. The authors claimed that a survival advantage is associated with receiving surgical SOC and overall treatment by a GO. But persistent survival differences, particularly among those not receiving the SOC, requires further investigation. This manuscript provides useful information to the medical students, clinicians, and researchers in this field, therefore, is acceptable for publication in World Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology. That is all.
