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

Dr. Canavese provided an interesting review regarding relationships between growth of the spine and the thoracic cage development. The authors thoroughly reviewed several concerns about treatment of the growing spine, especially focused on growth of the spine, thoracic cage development, and pulmonary function. Treatment of the growing spine is a challenging area. I agree that a short straight spine, produced by an early arthrodesis is no longer generally accepted or recommendable.

Nice article, but several issues 1. english language editing is required. There is awkward language, inappropriate sentence structure. This needs major revision. 2. The structure of the paper with the headings is not conducive to a review article. The authors should revise this paper and not duplicate the results and discussion. I suggest the following structure: abstract, introduction, methods (this can be short), then the substance of the paper. Then a conclusion section to summarize the points.
