**Summary** The present work focused on recurrent renal diseases after kidney transplantation with particular attention being paid to the recurrence of two groups of renal diseases including the first category with complement over-activation and the second category involving complement dysregulation. Since these nephropathies are genetically determined abnormality of the complement proteins, they are unlikely to be corrected by the transplant itself or immunosuppressive therapy. In addition to mentioning the diagnosis and treatment of renal diseases after kidney transplantation with citation of relevant literature, the authors also described in details the underlying pathophysiology. Overall, the article is informative and can be read with advantages to the readers. **Major Comments** Given the comprehensive nature of the present work, this reviewer has no major comments regarding its contents. On the other hand, attention paid to minimize typos and grammatical errors would greatly increase the value of the article. **Minor Comments** 1. Abbreviations such as "HUS" should be spelled out in full as they first appeared in the abstract. 2. The captions of the figures should be removed from the figures and should not be part of the picture

The manuscript has been sent to the American Journal Experts to improve the English spelling and grammar and to avoid any mistake

HUS has been spelled at its first appearance as all other abbreviations
