Here are my comments and critiques; 1- The article requires be reviewing, editing by an English-speaking person to correct the grammar and spelling mistakes. 2- Re-organize the paper to reflect its aims and get rid of the repeated information and statements. 3- The authors have to give clear suggestion and recommendation to handle the problem after reviewing all the published data and based on their experience in the field as well as their institutional practice. 4- Overall all, the article can be published after major editing job, the scientific aims and objectives are within the scope of the journal.
