But, I have some questions about title and study results. 1) The results of study apply only the region where the study was conducted because the incidence of ulcerative disease in the ileo-cecal region varies from region to region. I think that India or New Delhi terms should be added in the title. 2) I think that the number of patients is relatively small. And, only 6% patients undergoing colonoscopy had ileocecal ulcers. What findigs are there in other patients? 3) Behcet's disease and vasculitis can cause ileocecal ulcers. Especially, Behcet's disease is a common disease in the middle Asia. How do you explain that there weren't any Beh?et's diasease in your cohort? 4) "Non-spesific ulcers", "Idiopathic ulcers" or "Unreason ulcers" Which term should be used?. I think non-spesific ulcer is a pathological definition. Thank you very much..
