We thank you a lot for your insightful suggestions. We underline that lymphatic embolization and microvascular infiltration have the same meaning of lymphatic invasion and venous invasion in microscopic context. A further study in which we classify the grade of lymphatic invasion and venous invasion, respectively, could be useful to better identify prognostic factors for recurrence. It seems that the in-depth pathological examinations are needed to all patients to manage a tailored post-operative therapy and follow up. So, we certainly agree with your idea of extra pathological examination. However, adding a subgroup of patients would change the focus of this article. We will absolutely consider your suggestion in our next

study. To address your suggestion in the current article, we added a paragraph in the “Discussion” session (page 10 in the middle).
