COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors show that the increasing incidence of prostate cancer in Arab countries is worrying and there is need to raise awareness in both men and physicians for this problem. They conclude that encouraging PSA test before age 50 and 70 could be beneficial. The letter is interesting and deserves publication in WJCO, but I suggest a more detailed commentary for the indication of PSA test before age 50. PSA test is not specific and therefore hardly can predict early prostate cancer in young men, too. The rationale for the advantages the authors are expecting from this intervention, should be better specified. A minor observation concerns the abstract and core tip sections, both containing the same phrases found in the text. I suggest an effort to get a summary that does not contain copies of the phrases. Finally, the English language should be carefully revised, in some parts of the text there are difficulties to understand what the authors



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would mean.
